





# **Supporting Parents and Carers**

Having a child with a physical disability can be an isolating experience. Not only are there so many medical issues to learn about but so many activities become difficult to access and inappropriate for the disabled child. We aim to help parents feel less isolated, providing support, solidarity, and friendship to families through regular events at our community hub.

Many families have described us as a lifeline, especially in the early stages, describing how talking to other parents who genuinely understand how they feel has helped them to get through some tough times. Often parents will get advice from fellow parents that they could never get anywhere else – those little tips to get through normal everyday life that no one else can teach you.

### **Our Dedicated Staff**

#### Sing-sign Workshops

# YouTube Learning Channel

### 127 videos and over 90,000 views

Through this channel our charity reaches children throughout the UK who have Social Anxieties and/or Physical Disabilities that prevent them from attending live productions.

All our films include online resources supporting families to create a multi-sensory, interactive experience for their children while watching at home. A pause symbol encourages them to gather together their costumes and props to make the ensuing scene an interactive and sensory experience for their child. Makaton signing and close captioning assist those who have Hearing Impairments or Speech, Language & Communication Needs.



We provide experiences in all aspects of theatre craft: videography, stage management, directing, performance, front-of-house, merchandising and hospitality. We work with students transitioning from Special Schools and presenting with a wide variety of learning difficulties and disabilities.





### **Professional Placement Scheme**

This scheme employs disabled young people to work alongside our professional actors on film sets. They receive parity pay while receiving mentoring and guidance. This scheme is being expanded into a Transitions into Employment Programme, supporting NEET disabled young people to find employment or permanent volunteer placements.

# Structure, Governance and Management

Following its governing Constitution, its aim is to relieve the needs of persons of all ages and, where consistent with the aforesaid aims, the Charity will also support local and disadvantaged communities.
The activities of the Charity are overseen by a board of Trustees, each bringing an aspect of skill, experience and/or networking capability which contributes to fulfilment of the Charity's aims. Each Trustee is made aware of, and has due regard for, the Charity Commission's public benefit guidance and of the scope of the Charity's aims and activities. Training is offered to all Trustees. Applicants are selected for the value of their existing experience, with a view to providing the Charity with a suitably broad range of skills. The Charity's Trustees at the date of this report are
. Resignations during the year were received from  . Pro bono Chief Executive duties continue to be undertaken by the Charity's Founder,  The charity is indebted to all for their support.
Funding
• Earned Income rose by 54%.
Grants increased by 136% due to refurbishment funding which lifted the Charity from Cash to Accruals Accounting.
With a reduction in staffing and more reliance on volunteering the Charity lowered its wage bill by 18%.
• Filming, production and touring costs showed a slight increase, in line with inflation.
The core cost grant of, ceased in Spring 2024. Through this generous funding the Charity has been able to employ some part-time members of staff to assist in key positions, supplementing the work of volunteers and ensuring that may continue supporting children with special needs and their families.

## **Policy on Reserves**

• The Trustees have agreed that, from unrestricted reserves, the Charity should maintain a contingency of representing four months of fixed operating costs.

#### **Public Benefit**

• It is a source of pride to the Charity that all its activities have continued to be achieved at relatively low administrative cost in financial terms with most of its income at the disposal of its beneficiaries. The Charity has an equal ratio of volunteers to paid staff with volunteers supporting most of its administrative departments. The Independent Examiner of the annual accounts provides his services free of charge. The Trustees are satisfied that the Charity's activities for the year were in line with its aims and have had public benefit, having regard to the guidance on the latter issued by the Charity Commission.
